The construction of our new Design and Technology / Art Studio continues to move along and whilst it has created some challenges around movement to the JP Playground and canteen this has been managed capably by both staff and students. Before the end of the term we will also be moving construction (destruction?) into the Front Office Area which will require further planning and movement of staff. We are grateful for the cooperation and foresight of our builder, Kym Clarke Constructions, who has made the process as simple as possible given the scope of the build.

The School and Preschool now have their own QR codes to assist with signing in as visitors enter through the front office. It is vital that all parent entry is through the front office to enable you to sign in when picking up children etc. The Department for Education is continuing to run a conservative line around access to site and limiting adult numbers outside of staff - I appreciate this is frustrating but something we are expected to adhere to.

Next Tuesday evening is our Governing Council AGM. Governing Council plays an important role in the decision making of the school and is a great way to be involved while also learning about a lot of the information and evidence that sits behind the way we do things in Education. It is certainly

#### **AG 2021**

Ag students have hit the ground running.

The Yr 11 group Preg Testing the school ewes with the assistance of Amy Kerley. Of the 19 ewes they have 10 ewes having twins and 7 having a single lamb. They attended a Sheep and Cattle feeding workshop at Simon Giddings farm to assist with knowledge on feeding pregnant ewes sponsored by Advantage Feeders.

The Yr 12 boys have already had a meeting with Craig Povey, explaining the intricacies of Grain Marketing and have proceeded to sell the 5.2 tonnes of Feed Barley and 21.6 tonnes of H2 Wheat.

They have also met with George Pedler to plan the 2021 cropping program. Toby and Will had some interesting discussions with George and are currently organising to do some experimental ripping with various machines.

Yr 10 are doing a farm safety audit and making movies.

Yr 7 students are busy collecting yabbies and putting them in the yabbie tank, whilst also preparing plots for herb planting.

Our Year 8's are all about chickens and looking at collecting fertile eggs and incubating them.

We've all been very busy, with all this in just 2 short weeks of school.

#### esafety's Parent Guide to Cyberbullying and Online Drama


This Safer Internet Day 2021 webinar will look at how parents and carers can support young people to have safe and respectful online relationships and what to do if things go wrong. It will cover:
