SAPSASA 2021

With the release of the 2021 Sapsasa calendar, Term 1 looks to once again be very busy in regard to Sapsasa events and trials. Last year nearly all Sapsasa carnivals in Adelaide took place, a number with modifications due to COVID-19. Swimming, Athletics and Cross Country unfortunately were cancelled completely.

As 2021 is the last year that Year 7 students will be involved in Sapsasa, there have been a number of changes brought in to help cater for the Year 6 cohort of students who may very well miss out on selection being the younger group of students. In Football, Netball and Soccer, which have the largest number of students who trial, there will be a Year 7 carnival and a Year 6 carnival for each. Obviously, only Year 7 students can trial for the Year 7 teams and Year 6 students for the Year 6 teams. Trials dates will be held at the same time for both year levels. 

Exclusion Periods

The need for exclusion depends on:

- the ease with which the infection can be spread
- the ability of the infected person to follow hygiene precautions
- whether or not the person has some immunity to the infection (either vaccination or past infection)
- to a lesser extent, the severity of the disease

Definitions

Exclusion periods are based on the time that a person with a specific disease or condition might be infectious to others. Non-exclusion means there is not a significant risk of transmitting infection to others. A person who is not excluded may still need to remain at home because he or she does not feel well.

A contact is any person who has been close enough to an infected person to be at risk of naving acquired the infection from that person.
