## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

This newsletter sees us in the middle of two significant sporting events at our school and it is a time where we are reminded of the great support that we receive from our school community as without them these events couldn't take place.


Swimming Carnival was a successful day with amazing weather and it was a pleasure to have our parents and families at the pool watching. We'd like to acknowledge the work that the Cummins Pool did in preparing for us, including the catering and the Sports Committee for their organisation. Participation was at a premium, as was sportsmanship. Congratulations to Oscar and Alinta Dingwall who both broke records on the day and to all of the age group medal winners. The overall result saw Sturt in third place and Flinders winning by a very close margin over Eyre. The closeness of the scores increases the value of participation points at Sports Day so I'm sure all of our House Captains are keen to see large numbers of people next Wednesday doing their best.

Sports Day is next Wednesday at the Town Oval. For those families new to our school, students from yrs. 3-12 participate in a range of events and it is run in a Tabloid Format with all students attempting every event. Finals will be held in some running events. Junior Primary students run a session alongside of the "big kids" in the morning and this is a spectacle of joy and laughter that leaves us with some tired young people. We are fortunate to have a number of family and community members who support us on this day and encourage maximum participation from our students. Hopefully Eyre can overcome the small deficit from Swimming Carnival and come home with a win!

This year we are continuing our work on writing improvement as a site. Just like our students, staff have been engaged in learning opportunities so that we are able to develop a consistent approach to improving the writing outcomes for our students. Our current focus is around the use of mentor texts to support our students to understand what good writing looks like and how each subject area has styles and techniques that are particular to them. Our JP staff are focusing on building the phonics skills of our children given the significant role that this knowledge plays in becoming a successful reader. Programs such as Initialit and the use of decodable readers for our beginning students play a solid part in the development of these skills. We are also reflecting on the Australia wide research on Mathematics skills in Yr. 5-9 students and focusing on developing multiplicative thinking which is basically a technical term for a way of developing the problem solving

skills and strategies of our students. All of these are long term goals - we do not expect them to be competed in 1 or even 3 years but the process is about developing a defined plan of attack. We will update you on what we are working on and share with you any tips and ideas to allow you to support your child/ren at home.

Staff are looking forward to catching up with as many families as possible at the Community welcome this Friday night. I would like to thank Susie Hansen for the work that she has done in liaising with other members of the Enterprise committee on the school's behalf. If you are yet to send in your RSVP, please do so ASAP for catering purposes. Last year saw us unable to connect with our families for a significant amount of the year so we are endeavouring to take advantage of as many opportunities as possible whilst we can.

Red, yellow and blue were dominant colours, as students proudly displayed their house allegiance and cheered encouragement for all competitors. 25 metre freestyle, breaststroke and backstroke races were timed and competition was keen with many close outcomes.

Congratulations to Alinta and Oscar Dingwall who continued their record breaking form of 2020. Five new records were broken, with
 Alinta breaking all of her four age group events.
