Over the next few weeks our magnificent art installation will take shape thanks to the drive and determination of Ms Koch and Mrs George and the participation of all students across the school. Thanks must go to Donna Bagshaw for the work she has done in organising this commemoration and for advocating for our ATSI students to have a week filled with opportunities for them to showcase their pride in their cultural heritage.
