PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Yet another busy term draws to a close. It has been a term filled with lots of highlights and events and it continues right through this week as well, thus the decision to hold off the newsletter so that we could capture most of these before we all head off on a well-earned break.

Our Student Voice leaders held a fantastic Secondary Assembly, and it was great to have a number of parents and community members in attendance. The theme of the Assembly was based around our school values and four



videos were created by classes to share the essence of them with our school community. Values awards were presented to a number of students, and along with these we were able to celebrate some of the great achievements of our students with their peers. An entertaining short film from our Yr. 11 students, some inspiring Art from Elsie Maddern as part of a state-wide project on centenarians and a piano performance from our Stage 2 Music student Hunter Holt were highlights, along with summaries of many sporting events and Outdoor Education camps. Student Executive plan to run these assemblies each term to highlight and celebrate our students' achievements in and out of the classroom.

Last Friday we were fortunate to play host to a music Workshop involving students from Port Lincoln. The music emanating from the Hall was next level and it was a fabulous opportunity for our students to collaborate with students from other schools. Thanks to Colin Campbell and Scott McConnell from Instrumental music services for coordinating the event and Andrew Carey for creating a short clip of the day as a way of recording the learning.

Our Yr. 11 Media Studies Students participated in the 48hr Short Film Festival on the weekend. This involved spending the weekend at the school with Miss Koch creating a short film for the competition. Whilst I am yet to see the results, I have heard from Mr. Ford that it is excellent viewing. I have been very impressed with the calibre of film production from our Yr. 11 students this year and am sure this will be no exception.

As always, our students have been attending a range of sporting events. Most notably, we have had a number of students representing Lower Eyre Peninsula in Athletics last Friday as they competed in Country Division 1. On Monday we participated in the EEPASSA Interschool Athletics Carnival at Tumby Bay. After two wins in two years, the pressure was on for the 2022 team, captained by Henry Turnbull and Holly Gale to come away with the "Threepeat". It was a tight contest all day, but we were thrilled to be named Overall Champions at the end of the day, with a solid third in the Ball Games Shield and 6th in the Handicap Shield, which was won by Cowell. Whilst it is obviously a great achievement to win three years straight, more importantly the feedback from staff that attended was that they were incredibly impressed with our students' willingness to support each other, to be part of the team and fill in for ill team members unable to make the day, and to genuinely live up to the school values in a very public forum. Great work to everyone involved – the staff for their organisation, the many parents who attended

and transported students and the team itself for gaining just reward for their commitment, effort and determination.

This Thursday night our Yr. 10 Youth Opportunities students will be graduating from the 2022 course. As always, we thank Paul Stoddard and Lucy Pedler for delivering the course and the Cummins and District Community Bank for their very generous sponsorship. I look forward to attending the graduation and hearing students speak of how they have grown throughout the program and the strategies and techniques that they will take with them into the future.

The Public Holiday saw the commencement of the bitumen being laid in the bus Bay. This has been a long sought-after project and it is exciting to see it completed. We also recognise the improved safety aspects of having buses coming and going from the Bus Bay. At this stage we anticipate this area being back in action at the start of next term - it has been a challenge keeping the bus drivers from a few test runs this term. After many years of potholes and bumps it is going to be a delight for them to drive

Planning is well underway for 2023 with subject selections completed for our most of secondary students. We are building our staffing profile around this and establishing Primary class structures to align with the numbers of students in each year level. Further information will be available next term as we finalise plans.

LEADER'S READING CHALLENGE AWARD:



West Java has developed the Leader's Reading Challenge based on the South Australian Premier's Reading Challenge. As part of an ongoing cultural and business exchange between States, the Indonesian Government has partnered with the South Australian Government and funded the Indonesian Leader's Reading Challenge Competition. French Language classes were given the opportunity to extend their cross-cultural awareness by participating in this competition. Students needed to read a book about Indonesia and then write a Book review about their Indonesian text. Our students were given a traditional folk tale from Indonesia titled 'The Story of Kancil'.

Recently, with great excitement, we learnt that 12 of our students received recognition of their efforts in the Competition and were awarded with a participation certificate. In addition, we learnt that one of our students, Zack Modra, was successful in winning one of the 50 Reading medals, reflecting his ability to concisely convey the cultural themes of the Indonesian text.


SCHOOL HOLIDAY HOURS:
