Track and Field

23rd On the September, the Lower Eyre Peninsula Sapsasa Track and Field Team competed in Adelaide at the Country Sapsasa Carnival. This year the athletics carnival was held at a different venue. Salisbury Athletics Centre.

The team was in Division 1, with our students battling it out against the best athletes from country South Australia. LEP finished 5th out of 10 districts, a fantastic



effort considering the distance from Adelaide and difficulty in organising transport to and from the event.

Zack Modra, Ellie-Mae Hancock, Della Pedler, Taleah Turner, Jobe Crettenden and Kenzie Hancock were selected in the team and Kellie Symons, from Cummins Area School, was the coach.

Results

There were some fantastic results on the day with three Cummins students earning medallions for their efforts. Jobe Crettenden won a silver medal in the 10 boys Shot Putt, Kenzie Hancock won a bronze medal in the 10 girls 800 metres and Della Pedler won a gold medal in the 11 Girls 4 x 100 metres relay.

Ellie-Mae was in the 12 girls Shot Putt, 800 metres and 4 \times 100 metres relay.

Kenzie was also in the High Jump and Long Jump.

Jobe competed in the Discus as well.







BYOD LAPTOP PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS YR 7-12

All students from Year 7 to Year 12 are required to supply their own laptop for use at school.

We ask that ALL purchases of new laptops for school use, for all year levels, be made via the School Ordering Portal. This alleviates the current issue of the many varied devices being purchased which do not meet the required minimum specifications for use at school.

The online Order Portal provides families with a variety of suitable devices which meet the required specifications. including some accessories, insurance and finance options. The devices found on the portal have been chosen for their performance, durability of cases, compatibility and based on recommendations from industry experts. Please visit: https://cummins.orderportal.com.au

Other considerations when purchasing a device for your student:

- Insurance: check your home contents insurance to see if the device will be covered
- Transport between home and school: device should be carried in a sturdy protective bag away from food & water bottles
- Charging: Students must charge their device at home and bring it to school every day fully charged. (Personal power adapters are not to be used at school unless Tag Tested).
- Students have access to Microsoft Office 365 via their School email account at no cost, providing access to Word, Excel, Powerpoint, One Drive etc. There is no need to purchase this software separately.
- Whilst enrolled at school, students are connected to the school provided internet and are protected by a significant Departmental filtering system that prevents access to many harmful or malicious sites. According to Cummins Area School ICT Acceptable Use Policy, students may use the internet only for learning related activities that are approved by a teacher.
- It is the responsibility of the student / parent / caregiver to setup the Home-Internet connection on the device.
- Students must perform 'Software Updates' on the device as they become available in order to install the latest virus definitions and security patches.
- Students will use OneDrive provided through Office 365 which safeguards work from being lost on a USB etc. Students are also strongly encouraged to backup necessary files in numerous locations, including via email where appropriate. Technology failure is not an approved circumstance for extensions at Cummins Area School.

*Device chosen must take into consideration the types of subjects the student is studying eg; Design related subjects may require an i7 (Senior High School students)

**Please note; Apple devices are not recommended for use in our school environment as they are not compatible with our school network and will impact your child's ability to access school services such as printing. Apple devices will not be supported by the School IT Department.

We recommend 36-month payment plans that are approved online via Latitude. These plans not only help spread the cost for parents but are designed so the device is fully paid for at the end of the 36 month period.



Pick up close to home or work

Our site lets parents pick their Auspost Collection Point so they can choose to pick the device up near home or near their work which ever is easier for them (must be decided by the school).

GOVERNING COUNCIL UPDATE – MATERIALS AND SERVICES FEES FOR 2023

2023 fees:

The Governing Council proposes the amounts for the Materials and Services charges for 2023 are \$384 (\$16 increase on 2022) Foundation to Year 6 and \$470 (\$21 increase on 2022) for Years 7-12. These fees are above the minimum set out by DECD by \$115 per student and are detailed in the notices included in this newsletter.

In addition to Materials and Services charges as outlined above, there is a proposal to charge a subject fee for Design & Technology (Technical Studies) per semester as follows:

Year 9 (WOODWORK): \$30
Year 9 (METALWORK): \$30
Year 10 (WOODWORK): \$50
Year 10 (METALWORK): \$50

• Year 10 (ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY): \$50

It is the intention of the Governing Council to obtain approval for this fee rise via a parent/caregiver poll. This charge will be finalised at the next Governing Council meeting on Tuesday, 15th November at 7pm in the Library. All parents/caregivers/students are invited to attend this meeting and participate. If you are unable to attend the meeting then please contact me or email (CAS.govcouncil@gmail.com) with any questions/feedback prior to this meeting. Alternatively, a feedback box will be positioned in the school front office. Write down feedback and place in the box and please add your contact details if you wish to receive direct contact, information or answers to questions. I am also happy to meet anyone in person to discuss this.

Poll:

The polling process is set out by the Department for Education. Each family receives one vote per student. The poll must be conducted following the Governing Council meeting on 15th November 2022 and will be online. A link will be emailed to school families and there will be a 2 week period for voting to occur. The result will be determined by 50% + 1 of the votes. A poll outcome in favour of the fee rise above the minimum will mean the fees are compulsory (except for students with school cards). A poll outcome against the increase will mean the Governing Council will only seek the amount above the minimum as a voluntary contribution.

Reasoning for increasing fees:

The Materials and Services Charges fees are directed toward the daily use of items set out on the attached notices. Extra funds for these items allows the school to redirect funds within their flexible budget that would otherwise be spent on provision of materials. As a Governing Council, we are constantly looking at options to positively influence the learning of Cummins Area School students. The proposed fee will raise an estimated amount of \$46,000 for the 2023 school year.

This money supports covering some of the costs of our Materials and Services, but further enables:

- Improvement of student access to Information Technology including online services, wireless access, printers and computer hardware.
- Provision of items relevant to a supportive and integrative learning environment.
- The use of the latest advances in curriculum, including printing for students and photocopying of student resources.
