YEAR 5/6 CRICKET BLAST CARNIVAL

This year the Year 5/6 Cricket Blast Carnival was divided into two venues as SACA chose not to be involved. The Port Lincoln Schools played in Port Lincoln and Cummins hosted a carnival on Thursday 3rd November at the Cummins Oval. There were boys and girls separate competitions, with Ungarra Primary and Tumby Bay Area School each fielding a boy's and girl's team, while Cummins had two teams of boys and two teams of girls.

A round robin event was played with modified rules including:

- Playing with plastic wickets, bats and balls
- Each pair of batters batting together for two overs
- Each of the eight fielders bowling an over and rotating to field in every position
- A free hit for the batter was allowed following a noball or wide.

Cricket skills were introduced and developed during PE lessons. With plenty of cricket during the three matches for each team, player's knowledge of the game and strategies improved, batting, bowling and running between wickets all improved greatly.

Winners were Cummins White (undefeated) on 9 points, followed by Cummins Maroon 6 points, Tumby Bay 5 points and Ungarra 4 points.

Winners were Cummins Maroon (undefeated) on 9 points, followed by Cummins White 7 points, Ungarra 5 points and Tumby Bay 3 points.

Thankyou to the Cummins Rec Centre for allowing us to use the town oval (the outfield was slow but was amazingly green and lush!!) We had a fantastic day of fine, calm weather with great cricket!!



BYOD LAPTOP PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS YR 7-12

All students from Year 7 to Year 12 are required to supply their own laptop for use at school.

We ask that ALL purchases of new laptops for school use, for all year levels, be made via the School Ordering Portal. This alleviates the current issue of the many varied devices being purchased which do not meet the required minimum specifications for use at school.

The online Order Portal provides families with a variety of suitable devices which meet the required specifications. including some accessories, insurance and finance options. The devices found on the portal have been chosen for their performance, durability of cases, compatibility and based on recommendations from industry experts. Please visit: https://cummins.orderportal.com.au

Other considerations when purchasing a device for your student:

- Insurance: check your home contents insurance to see if the device will be covered
- Transport between home and school: device should be carried in a sturdy protective bag away from food & water bottles
- Charging: Students must charge their device at home and bring it to school every day fully charged. (Personal power adapters are not to be used at school unless Tag Tested).
- Students have access to Microsoft Office 365 via their School email account at no cost, providing access to Word, Excel, Powerpoint, One Drive etc. There is no need to purchase this software separately.
- Whilst enrolled at school, students are connected to the school provided internet and are protected by a significant Departmental filtering system that prevents access to many harmful or malicious sites. According to Cummins Area School ICT Acceptable Use Policy, students may use the internet only for learning related activities that are approved by a teacher.
- It is the responsibility of the student / parent / caregiver to setup the Home-Internet connection on the device.
- Students must perform 'Software Updates' on the device as they become available in order to install the latest virus definitions and security patches.
- Students will use OneDrive provided through Office 365 which safeguards work from being lost on a USB etc. Students are also strongly encouraged to backup necessary files in numerous locations, including via email where appropriate. Technology failure is not an approved circumstance for extensions at Cummins Area School.

*Device chosen must take into consideration the types of subjects the student is studying eg; Design related subjects may require an i7 (Senior High School students)

**Please note; Apple devices are not recommended for use in our school environment as they are not compatible with our school network and will impact your child's ability to access school services such as printing. Apple devices will not be supported by the School IT Department.

We recommend 36-month payment plans that are approved online via Latitude. These plans not only help spread the cost for parents but are designed so the device is fully paid for at the end of the 36 month period.



Pick up close to home or work

Our site lets parents pick their Auspost Collection Point so they can choose to pick the device up near home or near their work which ever is easier for them (must be decided by the school).



Wide range of payment options
