GOVERNING SCHOOL COUNCIL UPDATE

Governing School Council met on Tuesday 6th December for the final time for 2022.

Thankyou to all of those who voted in the Material and Services Poll. By all reports the online system worked well. The votes were de-identified and counted and voting for years both F-6 and years 7-12 were in favour of the increase in fees as suggested by the Governing Council. The fees of F-Year 6: \$384 and Years 7-12: \$470 are now set as compulsory for 2023.

If you have any questions regarding this process or the outcome, please feel free to contact any member of the Governing Council. This fee increase allows our school to improve the resources available to our children, so thankyou for your support.

At our meeting, Governing School Council also gave consideration to submissions regarding our school uniform. As most of you will be aware, to date the school has been unable to source an appropriate standard grey pant. As a result, many children are already wearing black pants or shorts.

Recent efforts to address this issue have again been unsuccessful, and our uniform supplier is unable to provide us with a grey custom made or off the shelf option.

Many students are already wearing black pants or shorts due to difficulties sourcing grey alternatives, and it is difficult for school staff to enforce the current grey bottoms when availability is challenging.

As a result, Governing School Council have voted in favour of trialling black OR grey bottoms in 2023. All other uniform items will remain the same.

Our Uniform Policy will be updated to reflect the change.

We hope to reform our uniform committee (which has been in recess) in 2023 and work towards having suitable options in both black and grey available through Sportscentre.

If you are interested in being involved in this committee, please get in contact with me.

In addition, there has been some discussion amongst members of our school community in regard to improving the outdoor play space/playgrounds/fencing within our school.

School Council would like to support the formation of a working party who will explore what this might look like and look at available funding options.

We have a couple of parents who have already shown an interest but would love to hear from anyone who is interested in being involved.

This is a great opportunity to have a positive impact on your children's school outdoor play spaces so please get in contact if you would like more information.

Governing School Council's AGM will take place on Tuesday of Week 4, Term 1 and I would encourage you to come along and be a part of this valuable committee.

SAPSASA REVIEW 2022

Cummins Area School has had a very busy year in 2022 with involvement in Sapsasa. With Year 7 students being part of secondary schools, the team events are now for Year 5 and 6 students.

Cummins had 29 students who were selected in teams which travelled to Adelaide to compete in teams over three days or one day carnivals. These 29 students were selected in 11 different sporting teams.

2 students competed in LEP District days in Port Lincoln while 89 students participated in carnivals for Year 3/4 classes or Year 5/6 classes held in Tumby Bay or Cummins.

On Friday, 25th November, five primary students competed in the annual LEP Sapsasa District Swimming Carnival held at the Port Lincoln Pool. Oisin Fox, Dustin Siviour, Elkie Dunbar, Gus Puckridge and Aoibheann Fox competed in various stroke races during the day.

Results

Dustin had a great day coming first in the 11 boys 50 metres freestyle (20 seconds ahead of the second place swimmer), first in 50 metres breaststroke and first in 50 metres backstroke. He was also second in the 11 years mixed 50 metres butterfly and third in Open boys 100 metres freestyle.

Oisin came away with two ribbons - second in the 13 boys 50 metres freestyle and third in the 50 metres backstroke.

Aoibheann won a third ribbon in the 10 & under girls breaststroke.

All students got plenty of swimming during the day and enjoyed the chance to compete against other students from various schools on the Lower Eyre Peninsula.






BYOD LAPTOP PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS YR 7-12

All students from Year 7 to Year 12 are required to supply their own laptop for use at school.

We ask that ALL purchases of new laptops for school use, for all year levels, be made via the School Ordering Portal. This alleviates the current issue of the many varied devices being purchased which do not meet the required minimum specifications for use at school.

The online Order Portal provides families with a variety of suitable devices which meet the required specifications. including some accessories, insurance and finance options. The devices found on the portal have been chosen for their performance, durability of cases, compatibility and based on recommendations from industry experts. Other considerations when purchasing a device for your student:

- Insurance: check your home contents insurance to see if the device will be covered
- Transport between home and school: device should be carried in a sturdy protective bag away from food & water bottles
- Charging: Students must charge their device at home and bring it to school every day fully charged. (Personal power adapters are not to be used at school unless Tag Tested).
- Students have access to Microsoft Office 365 via their School email account at no cost, providing access to Word, Excel, Powerpoint, One Drive etc. There is no need to purchase this software separately.
- Whilst enrolled at school, students are connected to the school provided internet and are protected by a significant Departmental filtering system that prevents access to many harmful or malicious sites. According to Cummins Area School ICT Acceptable Use Policy, students may use the internet only for learning related activities that are approved by a teacher.
- It is the responsibility of the student / parent / caregiver to setup the Home-Internet connection on the device.
- Students must perform 'Software Updates' on the device as they become available in order to install the latest virus definitions and security patches.
- Students will use OneDrive provided through Office 365 which safeguards work from being lost on a USB etc. Students are also strongly encouraged to backup necessary files in numerous locations, including via email where appropriate. Technology failure is not an approved circumstance for extensions at Cummins Area School.

*Device chosen must take into consideration the types of subjects the student is studying eg; Design related subjects may require an i7 (Senior High School students)

**Please note; Apple devices are not recommended for use in our school environment as they are not compatible with our school network and will impact your child's ability to access school services such as printing. Apple devices will not be supported by the School IT Department.

Pick up close to home or work







