CUMMINS AREA SCHOOL SPORTS DAY - YEARS 3 -12

Mild, calm weather conditions prevailed for the annual Foundation to Year 12 Cummins Area School Sports Day. The event was on Wednesday 1st March at the Cummins Town Oval. In the morning, the Junior Primary students enjoyed a range of activities which highlighted a variety of coordination and sporting skills.

Due to time restrictions and high levels of participation, a number of events were held prior to the Sports Day. These events included long jump, triple jump, 800 metres and 1500 metres.

Sports Day events included a wide range of running events and well as high jump and three throwing field events. Novelty events (tug of war, spoke relay and football relay) provided fierce competition between the three sports house. With the chance to gain points for participation, all students had a go and tried their best, which was extremely pleasing to see. The Sports Day finished off with mixed house relays shuttle relays for the 12 and under ages and 4 x 100 metres for the 13 years and older.

The captains for Eyre, Hudson Mickan and Norah Pedler (Primary), Archer Pertzel and Holly Gale (Secondary), accepted both the Jenny Kennett Shield for the championship points and the Danny Hughes Shield for the combination of championship and novelty points. Final points for the day were Eyre 4010 points, followed by Flinders on 3722 points and Sturt with 2950 points.

In each age group, a medal was presented to the student who accumulated the most individual points from all of their events. Congratulations to the individual winners, who are listed below.

2023 SSSA - SECONDARY SCHOOL SPORTS ASSOCIATION SWIMMING VICTORY

Three Cummins Area School students, Braden Holley, Tori Siviour and Lucy Siviour, were selected into the Eyre Peninsula and Upper North Secondary Swimming Team. The team was made up of students from 9 schools, representing the region including Streaky Bay Area School, Port Lincoln High School, Navigator College (Port Lincoln), St Josephs School (Port Lincoln), Cummins Area School, Cleve Area School, Samaritan College (Whyalla), Whyalla Secondary College and Caritas College (Port Augusta). They competed in the B Grade Championships at the SA Aquatic and Leisure Centre on the 27th February, and were named overall champion team.

The girls team were outright winners finishing over 100 points in front, whilst the boys team finished 5th with only 70 points separating the top 5 teams. When the combined point scores were tallied, the Eyre Peninsula and Upper North Secondary Swimming Team finished with a total of 1448 points securing the overall win in front of second placed team Westminster School.

Congratulations to all three students who competed and finished with some fantastic results, especially given that at times, they were swimming against students much older than themselves. Both Tori and Lucy achieved some Personal Best (PB) times.

BYOD LAPTOP PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS YR 7-12

All students from Year 7 to Year 12 are required to supply their own laptop for use at school.

We ask that ALL purchases of new laptops for school use, for all year levels, be made via the School Ordering Portal. This alleviates the current issue of the many varied devices being purchased which do not meet the required minimum specifications for use at school.

The online Order Portal provides families with a variety of suitable devices which meet the required specifications. including some accessories, insurance and finance options. The devices found on the portal have been chosen for their performance, durability of cases, compatibility and based on recommendations from industry experts. Please visit: https://cummins.orderportal.com.au

Other considerations when purchasing a device for your student:

- Insurance: check your home contents insurance to see if the device will be covered
- Transport between home and school: device should be carried in a sturdy protective bag away from food & water bottles
- Charging: Students must charge their device at home and bring it to school every day fully charged. (Personal power adapters are not to be used at school unless Tag Tested).
- Students have access to Microsoft Office 365 via their School email account at no cost, providing access to Word, Excel, Powerpoint, One Drive etc. There is no need to purchase this software separately.
- Whilst enrolled at school, students are connected to the school provided internet and are protected by a significant Departmental filtering system that prevents access to many harmful or malicious sites. According to Cummins Area School ICT Acceptable Use Policy, students may use the internet only for learning related activities that are approved by a teacher.
- It is the responsibility of the student / parent / caregiver to setup the Home-Internet connection on the device.
- Students must perform 'Software Updates' on the device as they become available in order to install the latest virus definitions and security patches.
- Students will use OneDrive provided through Office 365 which safeguards work from being lost on a USB etc. Students are also strongly encouraged to backup necessary files in numerous locations, including via email where appropriate. Technology failure is not an approved circumstance for extensions at Cummins Area School.

*Device chosen must take into consideration the types of subjects the student is studying eg; Design related subjects may require an i7 (Senior High School students)

**Please note; Apple devices are not recommended for use in our school environment as they are not compatible with our school network and will impact your child's ability to access school services such as printing. Apple devices will not be supported by the School IT Department.


Sea Week
