## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

We are certainly on the downhill run to the end of term one. As always, time has flown and it has been a busy start to the year with lots of important events checked off.

NAPLAN testing has finished for 2023 and we completed somewhere around 500 tests over the two week window of testing. The early testing timeline should see results available earlier in the year and ensure they are ready to be used to inform teaching programs.



We are aware that our new communication platform, XUNO, is causing considerable angst due to its rather erratic performance. We have had limited issues with the staff and student portals but the Parent App appears to be particularly problematic. If you are having issue with the app we encourage you to screenshot the errors and send through to the school email address, dl.0754.info@schools.sa.edu.au so that we can forward them to Xuno support. We assure you that we are working hard on this issue and aim to have it sorted ready to start term 2 at the latest.

Recently buses were held back after school for a period of time due to a fire on Golf Course Road. I am aware that there has been some questioning of why all buses were held when not all routes go in that direction. To clarify, any fire that impacts either a bus route or the township of Cummins sees our school placed under the command of DfE's Security and Emergency Management team. This means that all decisions regarding release of buses, activation of Bushfire action Plans and evacuations is directed by this group, taking decisions out of the hands of the site. This is due to the fact that this team is trained in risk management and have access to up-to-date emergency service information etc. We have had the opportunity to feed back to the team after this event re the logistics of the process etc and will continue to work with the team to ensure the safety of our students if such an event occurs again in the future.

Last week our Yr. 12 Outdoor Education students paddled their way through 40 + kms and camped out for 2 nights. Whilst I am sure the camp itself was a great learning experience, the majority of the focus was on the planning and implementation of the excursion. It has been fantastic to watch this subject continue to grow in 2023 with classes in Yrs. 10, 11 and 12.

Wednesday sees our Interschool team heading off to Kimba to defend our title at EEPASSA. It is always exciting to test our talents against our fellow Area Schools and showcase our sportsmanship along the way. In a busy week for some of our Primary students, this is followed by the Lower Eyre SAPSASA Athletics Day in Port Lincoln on Thursday. Thanks to the parents who are providing transport and supporting our students at these two events. As always we would be challenged to participate without your efforts.



# BYOD LAPTOP PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS YR 7-12

All students from Year 7 to Year 12 are required to supply their own laptop for use at school.

We ask that ALL purchases of new laptops for school use, for all year levels, be made via the School Ordering Portal. This alleviates the current issue of the many varied devices being purchased which do not meet the required minimum specifications for use at school.

The online Order Portal provides families with a variety of suitable devices which meet the required specifications. including some accessories, insurance and finance options. The devices found on the portal have been chosen for their battery performance, durability of cases, network compatibility and based on recommendations from industry experts. Other considerations when purchasing a device for your student:

- Insurance: check your home contents insurance to see if the device will be covered
- Transport between home and school: device should be carried in a sturdy protective bag away from food & water bottles
- Charging: Students must charge their device at home and bring it to school every day fully charged. (Personal power adapters are not to be used at school unless Tag Tested).
- Students have access to Microsoft Office 365 via their School email account at no cost, providing access to Word, Excel, Powerpoint, One Drive etc. There is no need to purchase this software separately.
- Whilst enrolled at school, students are connected to the school provided internet and are protected by a significant Departmental filtering system that prevents access to many harmful or malicious sites. According to Cummins Area School ICT Acceptable Use Policy, students may use the internet only for learning related activities that are approved by a teacher.
- It is the responsibility of the student / parent / caregiver to setup the Home-Internet connection on the device.
- Students must perform 'Software Updates' on the device as they become available in order to install the latest virus definitions and security patches.
- Students will use OneDrive provided through Office 365 which safeguards work from being lost on a USB etc. Students are also strongly encouraged to backup necessary files in numerous locations, including via email where appropriate. Technology failure is not an approved circumstance for extensions at Cummins Area School.

\*Device chosen must take into consideration the types of subjects the student is studying eg; Design related subjects may require an i7 (Senior High School students)

\*\*Please note; Apple devices are not recommended for use in our school environment as they are not compatible with our school network and will impact your child's ability to access school services such as printing. Apple devices will not be supported by the School IT Department.

The student environment often leads to a higher number of repairs. Onsite support at the school greatly reduces frustrations for parents. Getting a retail device repaired usually takes weeks and quite often requires the parent to take time out of their day.

We recommend 36-month payment plans that are approved online via Latitude. These plans not only help spread the cost for parents but are designed so the device is fully paid for at the end of the 36 month period.



# Pick up close to home or work

Our site lets parents pick their Auspost Collection Point so they can choose to pick the device up near home or near their work which ever is easier for them (must be decided by the school).



#### Wide range of payment options

We provide a wide range of online payment methods. note Credit Card and PAYPAL payments incur a 1% surcharge.


# Please note - CAS Canteen modified operating days for rest of Term 1 2023.






