## YEAR 10 OUTDOOR EDUCATION

In week 10 of Term 1, the year 10 Outdoor Education class travelled to Tractor Beach campground (Streaky Bay) for two nights.

The purpose of the trip was for students to (literally) immerse themselves in the marine ecosystem of the Streaky Bay area by snorkeling, surfing and fishing. Students snorkelled the smooth pool lagoon in small groups and dived for abalone for entree that night. The next day they woke early and spent 6 hours in the water surfing 1-2ft waves along Surfers Beach. To see all students progress in such a short time, and to be so supportive of their peers was amazing.

After a cracker sunset and fire on the beach, Mr Rowe made the students hike 5km down Yanerbie Beach on their last day at 7:30am. The waves were pumping, about 3ft, offshore with a storm rolling in from the south. Over half the students managed to ride along the green face of the wave, which is an incredible feat.

The highlight of the trip was to hear the year 10's reflect on how they treat each other at school, and how this changes when they are out camping together.

When out on the coast, they turned from rat-bag teenagers, to a rat-pack of frothing, supportive, accepting & positive little surf grommets.

### cash/envelope ordering

Your school prefers orders to be placed online. However, you are unable to order online, please complete your orde using the order envelope provided.

Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on the day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

IMPORTANT "mot for publication" students

If you have instructed your school that your child's image is "not for publication" (sometimes called "do not publish" or "not for media release" instructions), the school will ensure that your child is not presented to our photographers on photod ady and school photographs will not be available for purchase. If you wish to change your instruction, then your school, so they change their records and identify your child as able to be photographed for school photography purposes. All students presented to our photographers by your school on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages with their fellow students and these packages will be available to purchase by all families.



## BYOD LAPTOP PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS YR 7-12

All students from Year 7 to Year 12 are required to supply their own laptop for use at school.

We ask that ALL purchases of new laptops for school use, for all year levels, be made via the School Ordering Portal. This alleviates the current issue of the many varied devices being purchased which do not meet the required minimum specifications for use at school.

The online Order Portal provides families with a variety of suitable devices which meet the required specifications. including some accessories, insurance and finance options. The devices found on the portal have been chosen for their battery performance, durability of cases, network compatibility and based on recommendations from industry experts. Please visit: https://cummins.orderportal.com.au

Other considerations when purchasing a device for your student:

- Insurance: check your home contents insurance to see if the device will be covered
- Transport between home and school: device should be carried in a sturdy protective bag away from food & water bottles
- Charging: Students must charge their device at home and bring it to school every day fully charged. (Personal power adapters are not to be used at school unless Tag Tested).
- Students have access to Microsoft Office 365 via their School email account at no cost, providing access to Word, Excel, Powerpoint, One Drive etc. There is no need to purchase this software separately.
- Whilst enrolled at school, students are connected to the school provided internet and are protected by a significant Departmental filtering system that prevents access to many harmful or malicious sites. According to Cummins Area School ICT Acceptable Use Policy, students may use the internet only for learning related activities that are approved by a teacher.
- It is the responsibility of the student / parent / caregiver to setup the Home-Internet connection on the device.
- Students must perform 'Software Updates' on the device as they become available in order to install the latest virus definitions and security patches.
- Students will use OneDrive provided through Office 365 which safeguards work from being lost on a USB etc. Students are also strongly encouraged to backup necessary files in numerous locations, including via email where appropriate. Technology failure is not an approved circumstance for extensions at Cummins Area School.

\*Device chosen must take into consideration the types of subjects the student is studying eg; Design related subjects may require an i7 (Senior High School students)

\*\*Please note; Apple devices are not recommended for use in our school environment as they are not compatible with our school network and will impact your child's ability to access school services such as printing. Apple devices will not be supported by the School IT Department.

We recommend 36-month payment plans that are approved online via Latitude. These plans not only help spread the cost for parents but are designed so the device is fully paid for at the end of the 36 month period.



## Pick up close to home or work

Our site lets parents pick their Auspost Collection Point so they can choose to pick the device up near home or near their work which ever is easier for them (must be decided by the school).



## Wide range of payment options

We provide a wide range of online payment methods. note Credit Card and PAYPAL payments incur a 1% surcharge.
