PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Hi Everyone,

With winter sports now done and dusted for another year, we are aware that the really busy time of the year, harvest, is just around the corner. With the warmer weather comes the return of our hat policy and it has been an easy transition back into this practice for our students.



We are currently working on class structures for next year. These are dependent on accurate numbers so we would appreciate any information you can share with us re potential changes in 2024. Outdoor Education - Year 11 Bushwalk

In week 6 of term 3. the Year 11 Outdoor Education class had their first expedition for the semester, a 54 km bushwalk in Lincoln National Park.

The students walked around half of the coastline of the park, from Taylors Landing to Point Donnington and back down to Surfleet Cove. We were lucky with the weather, but headwinds made the trudging extra challenging at times. Students are currently designing a native revegetation proposal in class, so it was perfect timing for them to observe the coastal wildflowers blooming! (We are actually on the hunt for any tubes & trays that we can use for tree propagation. We need to grow about 1400 trees in our school nursery)

The year 11 students should be proud of the effort they put in, the blistering battle scars, their positive attitude and their cracking music choices on the last day. Looking forward to our Far West Aquatics trip next term!







School Sport SA - Sapsasa

Golf

The Sapsasa State Golf Championships were held in Adelaide on the 7th and 8th September. 10, 11 and 12 year old competed against each other in one section over 15 holes.

Congratulations to Sam Fitzgerald and Cyril Pedler from Cummins who were selected as part of the EP Sapsasa Team. Conditions were certainly not ideal for anyone playing golf, let alone 10 year olds. Winds of between 45 and 60kph made things tricky for all competitors. Metro students played on Thursday morning and Country students in the afternoon. There were 53 country boys and Sam scored 103 shots, coming 42nd whilst Cyril scored 122 shots coming in at 52nd.

On Friday morning a total 100 metro and country players competed in the State Championships with strong winds continuing from the previous day. Both boys greatly improved their score on the second day with Sam scoring 88 over 15 holes and coming 57th and Cyril scoring 96 and coming 78th. Well done boys!



Track & Field

The LEP Sapsasa Track and Field Team competed at the Sapsasa Country Championships on Monday 18th September. The LEP team of approximately 30 boys and girls competed in Adelaide with 6 Cummins athletes including Lucas Britza, Ronan Jutzen, Tom Shirley, Jobe Crettenden, Kenzie Hancock and Shaylee Britza.

Lower Eyre Peninsula was one of ten districts which competed in the Country Division 1 section. Our Cummins students picked up six medallions on the day. Kenzie 1st in 11 girls 1500 metres with a time of 5:35:97 minutes, 1st in 800 metres running in a time of 2:49:84 minutes and 3rd in long jump jumping 3.85 metres. Tom gained two medallions with 3rd in 11 boys 1500 metres with a time of 5:24:70 minutes and 2nd in 800 metres in 2:41:21 minutes. Shaylee was part of the 10 girls 4 x 100 metres relay team that gained third position in 1:06:64 minutes, just 0.3 seconds behind the winning relay team. Well done!

All students had an amazing time and gained valuable athletics experience. Thank you to parents for transporting their children to the one day event in Adelaide.



Royal Life Saving Swim Teacher Course

There is a shortage of Swimming Instructors so if you are interested in becoming an instructor then this is for you!

Royal Life are offering a Swim Teacher Course at Wudinna on Monday October 9th from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. The Royal Life Saving Swim Teacher Course provides the minimum requirements for those persons wishing to become a Swim Instructor (for ages 4 and above).

Open to anyone 16 years and over. There are no pre-requisites for this course.

It is assumed that participants are sufficiently physically fit and healthy to undertake this course. The following physical activities will occur during the course unless you advise of any physical difficulties or limitations: kneeling, bending over, crouching, standing, leaning, sitting, pushing, lifting weights, swimming 100m and tread water for 1min, towing, diving, carrying and other physical activity.

An optional CPR qualification to all Swim Teacher candidates is offered, which is conducted within the course (HLTAID009 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation). This is a requirement to obtain your RLSSA Swim Teacher License and must be renewed every 12 months to keep you license current. Please contact us if you already have a current CPR qualification and don't wish to complete this component. A valid Working With Children Check (WWCC) is required to undertake your practical training hours at an aquatic facility, as well as for your Swim Teacher License application.

BYOD LAPTOP PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS YR 7-12

All students from Year 7 to Year 12 are required to supply their own laptop for use at school.

We ask that ALL purchases of new laptops for school use, for all year levels, be made via the School Ordering Portal. This alleviates the current issue of the many varied devices being purchased which do not meet the required minimum specifications for use at school.

The online Order Portal provides families with a variety of suitable devices which meet the required specifications, including some accessories, insurance and finance options. The devices found on the portal have been chosen for their battery performance, durability of cases, network compatibility and based on recommendations from industry experts. Other considerations when purchasing a device for your student:

- Insurance: check your home contents insurance to see if the device will be covered
- Transport between home and school: device should be carried in a sturdy protective bag away from food & water bottles
- Charging: Students must charge their device at home and bring it to school every day fully charged. (Personal power adapters are not to be used at school unless Tag Tested).
- Students have access to Microsoft Office 365 via their School email account at no cost, providing access to Word, Excel, Powerpoint, One Drive etc. There is no need to purchase this software separately.
- Whilst enrolled at school, students are connected to the school provided internet and are protected by a significant Departmental filtering system that prevents access to many harmful or malicious sites. According to Cummins Area School ICT Acceptable Use Policy, students may use the internet only for learning related activities that are approved by a teacher.
- It is the responsibility of the student / parent / caregiver to setup the Home-Internet connection on the device.
- Students must perform 'Software Updates' on the device as they become available in order to install the latest virus definitions and security patches.
- Students will use OneDrive provided through Office 365 which safeguards work from being lost on a USB etc. Students are also strongly encouraged to backup necessary files in numerous locations, including via email where appropriate. Technology failure is not an approved circumstance for extensions at Cummins Area School.

*Device chosen must take into consideration the types of subjects the student is studying eg; Design related subjects may require an i7 (Senior High School students)

**Please note; Apple devices are not recommended for use in our school environment as they are not compatible with our school network and will impact your child's ability to access school services such as printing. Apple devices will not be supported by the School IT Department.

Pick up close to home or work

Our site lets parents pick their Auspost Collection Point so they can choose to pick the device up near home or near their work. which ever is easier for them (must be decided by the school).
